UK definition

A vulnerable adult ...

is or may be unable to take care of him or herself,

or unable to protect him or herself against significant harm or exploitation

because of mental or other disability, age or illness.

UNHCR

As vulnerable as asylum-seekers are, there are people within this group who face even greater risks, challenges, and problems, for example

- children who are orphaned or separated from their parents,
- traumatized individuals suffering from psychological problems,
- mothers and fathers raising children alone,
- victims of human trafficking,
- survivors of sexual and gender-based violence.

- permanent eg congenital disability

Situation



EU Qualification Directive


Member states to take into account situation of vulnerable persons such as


- minors,

- persons who have been subjected to physical or sexual violence.






Credibility in women's asylum claims







establishing minimum standards on the rights, support and protection of victims of crime




guarantee and publicise the right to request a female interviewer and interpreter

deliver comprehensive and mandatory training for interviewers and interpreters on sexual violence, trauma and memory



provide childcare during screening and asylum interviews



provide trauma counselling for women who have experienced gender-based harm

provide information about the asylum process, rights and entitlements specific to women seeking asylum
