The End FGM European Network 2021 Campaign is all about... Female Genital Mutilation & Intersectionality!


Ethnicity, religion, sexuality, education... our identities can influence our access to resources and healthcare and sometimes can expose us to additional discrimination and violence.

Do you know how diverse the people affected by FGM are?

Knowing this must shape the way we **fight the practice**. This year, we will **learn together** how to address FGM while **leaving no one behind!**



WHAT IS FGM?



Female Genital Mutilation is all procedures involving the removal of the external female genitalia or other injury to the female genital organs for non-medical reasons.

There are 4 types of FGM.

FGM can cause life-lasting physical and psychological trauma and is a violation of Human Rights. It is not prescribed by any religion. 200 million girls & women alive today have undergone FGM. At current rates, an additional estimated 68 million girls face being cut by 2030. The consequences of the Covid19 pandemic are yet to be measured, but it is estimated that 2 million more women & girls are at risk of undergoing FGM due to the disruption caused by the pandemic.



WHAT IS INTERSECTIONALITY?

Intersectionality is an <u>approach to feminism & social causes</u>. The term was coined by <u>Dr. Kimberlé Crenshaw</u> and refers to a theory about how **systems of power intersect** and reinforce each other.

In concrete terms this means that different forms of oppression (e.g. racism, sexism, homophobia...etc.) do not exist separately, but are overlapping and affect individuals simultaneously. Regarding feminism, it means that no one experiences life as "just a woman", other aspects such as race, class, disability...etc. play a role in the forms of discrimination people are exposed to.

For example, a Black Muslim woman in Europe will experience forms of discrimination that are **specific** to her identity, **not just the sum** of sexist & racist discriminations.



WHY IS THIS CAMPAIGN IMPORTANT?

Intersectionality means we cannot address only one form of oppression while ignoring all the others. Doing so creates blind spots in our work and can cause certain people to be left out. Even worse, neglecting intersectionality can also make us unwillingly reinforce the discriminations we are overlooking.

For example, if we **fight FGM without considering racism**, we can end up **reinforcing racist stereotypes** around the practice.
