

Terms of Reference: END FGM EU NEW regranting scheme – building resilient survivor-led, grassroots, and community-based initiatives to End FGM in Europe

Implementation Period: December 2025 – September 2026

Annual Budget Allocation for the whole project: €120,000 per year (€360,000 total/3years)

Number of Sub-Grants: 4–5 organisations per year (12–15 total/3 years)

Eliqible Applicants: END FGM EU Members (regardless of the type of membership) that fulfil all

criteria of this call

Grant Range: €24,000 – €30,000 per organisation per year

1. CONTEXT & STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK

1.1 Programme overview

The End FGM European Network (End FGM EU) is launching a new regranting scheme that focuses on strengthening and shifting power and resources directly to grassroots, survivor-led organisations across Europe. This scheme is designed to survivor-led organisations, grassroots or community-based organisations, operating in European countries with highest prevalences on FGM and are in underresourced contexts. This scheme operationalises our commitment to feminist financing, community ownership, and systemic change. Unlike project-based funding, this initiative provides semi-flexible support to strengthen organisational resilience, amplify survivor grassroot, community leadership, and drive sustainable social impact at local and national levels.

1.2 Strategic plan and alignment

This regranting scheme is anchored in <u>End FGM EU's Strategic plan (2023-2027)</u> and Theory of Change. End FGM EU operates under a five-year Strategic Plan (2023–2027), around two core priorities:

- 1. Advance the end FGM agenda in Europe, ensuring a coordinated, human rights-based, child- and community-focused approach: By promoting a coordinated, community-rooted, child-centred and rights-based approach, we aim to shape European and national-level policies. We work to counter negative narratives and elevate survivor voices within relevant institutions both at the national level through members and at the supranational level with a focus on European Union (EU) and Council of Europe (CoE) ensuring survivor voices are central in all spaces.
- 2. Consolidate the Network and strengthen its role as a sustainable, impactful collective force driving systemic change: We invest in member and ambassador capacity, care-centred leadership, and a flexible funding environment to ensure the resilience of grassroots organisations. Our goal is to be a long-term engine for change, driving systemic transformation with and for FGM-affected communities.

Our Theory of Change positions community ownership, survivor leadership, and structural transformation as interdependent levers of long-term change. This is operationalised through a logical framework guiding all programmes. When grassroots organisations receive flexible funding paired with

capacity-building support, they become powerful agents of systemic change shifting narratives, influencing policy, and creating protective environments for women and girls affected by FGM.

1.3 Strategic Objectives focus for the regranting

Objective 3: Enhance END FGM EU movement resilience and sustainability through diverse funding and strengthened structures

2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

2.1 Organisational eligibility

Applying organisations MUST meet the following criteria:

- Be Full or Associate Members of the End FGM European Network
- Have the capacity to deliver a proposal that includes realistic plans and a budget aligned with the applicant's capacity
- Have financial management skills and/or willingness to learn.

2.2 Target groups

This regranting scheme is designed for <u>survivor-led organisations</u>, <u>grassroots or community-based</u> organisations that are:

CRITICALLY UNDER-RESOURCED: Facing national government funding cuts or chronic underfunding, operating in countries/regions with limited anti-FGM infrastructure.

GEOGRAPHIC FOCUS: Operating in European countries with highest prevalences of FGM (please refer to the latest data on <u>FGM in Europe</u>) and/or where support for survivors is hard to reach or non-existing, working with underrepresented FGM-affected countries and communities, working to bridge urban-rural gaps or reaching isolated FGM-affected communities

3. FUNDING INFO

3.1 Grant size & duration

- Amount: €24,000 €30,000 per organisation
- Duration: 10/12 months each cycle
- Payment schedule:
 - o 70% upon signature of sub-grant agreement
 - o 30% upon satisfactory mid-term review (Month 6)

3.2 Eligible activities

Semi-flexible funding model: this means you have flexibility to define your priorities within The END FGM EU strategic priorities,

Grantees define their own priorities within one or more of these strategic areas:

- 1. Local/National advocacy (policy influence, institutional engagement, coalition-building)
- Community leadership & mobilisation (survivor leadership programmes, youth engagement, grassroots organising)
- 3. Organisational resilience (governance strengthening, staff capacity)

Non eligible activities

- Capital expenditures (building purchase, renovations)
- Activities outside Europe or unrelated to FGM
- Regranting to other organisations
- Profit-generating activities

3.3 Eligible costs

- Personnel costs (staff salaries, activities, stipend including for survivors/community experts,..)
- Travel & subsistence (advocacy meetings, training, community outreach)
- **Programme activities** (workshops, materials, research)
- Capacity-building (training, professional development)

4.3 Assessment criteria & Scoring matrix

STEP 1: Eligibility and administrative screening

IMPORTANT NOTE This scheme is specifically designed for survivor-led organisations, grassroots or community-based organisations, and those operating in high-prevalence or under-resourced contexts, addressing key gaps identified by the Network.

STEP 2: Full proposal review and selection

1. Organisational Profile, Capacity & Financial Health		Evaluation of financial stability, financial management systems, staffing capacity, and safeguarding policies.

Strategic alignment with End FGM EU Objectives	15 pts	Proposal contributes to Network-wide advocacy, capacity-building, or movement resilience.
3. Community leadership & target group engagement		The proposal outlines a clearly defined target community and robust strategy for their meaningful involvement in both the project's design and execution.
4. Implementation plan & risk management	10 pts	The timeline and activities are realistic and achievable within the grant period. Roles and responsibilities are clearly assigned, and there is a sound analysis of risks with appropriate mitigation strategies.
5. Feminist, intersectional & rights-based analysis	10 pts	The proposal explicitly details how the initiative embodies feminist and rights-based principles, centres affected communities, and addresses intersecting forms of discrimination (e.g. racism, migration status).
6. Innovation & transformative Potential		The project proposes creative approaches, tests new models, or scales proven practices. Potential for social impact beyond immediate beneficiaries
7. Monitoring, evaluation & learning (mel) plan		Clear indicators for success are defined. There is thoughtful learning questions proposed, and a solid commitment to knowledge-sharing with the wider Network.
8. Budget realism & cost- effectiveness	10pts	The budget is within the eligible range (€24,000–€30,000), detailed, justified, and aligns logically with the activities.

Minimum threshold: 70/100, Only the proposals with the best overall scores will be retained for funding.

5. NON-FINANCIAL SUPPORT PACKAGE

Every sub-grantee receives comprehensive accompaniment:

- Kick-off session (1 hour) clarify expectations
- Bi-monthly check-in calls (30-45 min) Progress monitoring,
- Mid-term learning conversation (Month 6) Reflective evaluation, adaptive management
- Final peer learning session (Months 11-12) Collective feedback, cross-organisational learning

6. MONITORING, REPORTING & ACCOUNTABILITY

6.1 Reporting requirements

Mid-term (Month 6):

- 1-hour virtual learning conversation
- Discussion guide shared in advance covering: progress, challenges, adaptations, learning
- Budget update (simple format)

Final (Month 11):

- Narrative report (max 5 pages):
 - o What did you set out to achieve?
 - What actually happened? (successes, surprises, setbacks)
 - o What did you learn?
 - o What will you do differently next time?
 - How has this grant strengthened your organisation?

Sub-grantees will evaluate their own social impact using some aspects of the tailored framework, ensuring measurable outcomes that contribute to the Network's collective goals while respecting their unique context and expertise.

• Financial report with supporting documents (receipts, invoices,)

7. RISK MANAGEMENT & SAFEGUARDING

7.1 Financial risks

8. KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT & LEARNING

Collective learning approach

This scheme is not just about funding it's about building a learning community on feminist funding.

Mechanisms:

- Regranting logbook Secretariat documents lessons learned, challenges, innovations
- **Annual Learning report** Sub-grantees exchange experiences, co-created synthesis of impact, trends, recommendations

9.1 Roles & responsibilities

End FGM EU selection comittee:

- Approves annual selection results
- Ensures strategic alignment with Network priorities

Secretariat (Director + Operations & Governance Officer, Program Officer):

- Designs and manages call process

- Monitors compliance and learning
- Reports to the Board

Sub-grantees:

- Implement agreed activities
- Participate in MEL and learning processes
- Contribute to Network advocacy and knowledge exchange
- Comply with financial and narrative reporting
